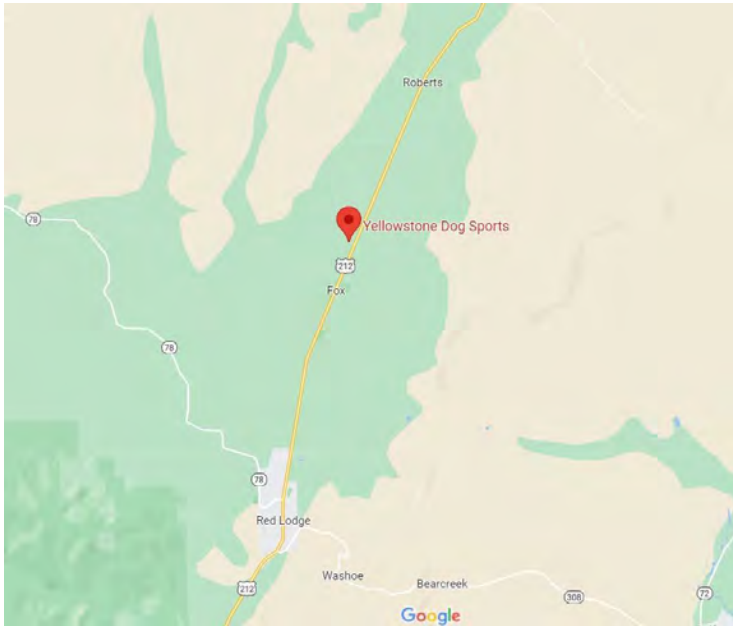

Take exit 446 to the Laurel Road. In 1.8 miles, at the second traffic light, turn left onto Moore Lane. Cross the railroad tracks and turn right onto Moore Lane. In 0.4 miles, the clinic will be on the left.

FAST CAT

The purpose of the AKC Fast CAT (Coursing Ability Test) event is to provide all dogs and their owners with an enjoyable, healthy activity in which they can participate. Dogs run singularly. The dog's time to complete the 100-yard (straight) dash is converted into MPH. Dogs earn points based on their handicapped speed. Titles are awarded when a dog has accumulated a given number of points.

Course

- The Start* • The dog may start up to 10 feet behind the starting line.
Finish • The course provides a minimum of 30 yards of safe run-out area.

Earning Points

A *handicap system* is applied to a dog's speed in MPH to determine the number of points earned. The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers.

- 18" or greater = handicap is 1.0
- 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5
- Below 12" = handicap is 2.0

Points – MPH multiplied by the dog's handicap.

Phone or fax entries will not be accepted. Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary's address. No entry shall be made, and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. Illegible entries will not be processed and, if possible, will be returned to the exhibitor.

REFUNDS

One hundred percent (100%) of entry fees will be refunded for any reason if a written (or email) request is received by the EVENT SECRETARY using "TRIAL CANCELLATION" in the subject line. To receive a refund, exhibitors must notify the Event Secretary promptly, and she must receive your notice on or before August 16, 2023, 6:00 pm MDT.

If you entered online using the AKC entry system, you must cancel your entry using the same system. Cancellations must be completed by the closing date.

No entry fee will be refunded if a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Field Committee or the Inspection Committee. No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed because of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, a public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. Anyone failing to clean up their dogs' waste, anyone exhibiting unsportsmanlike conduct, anyone responsible for unnecessary disturbance, or anyone who repeatedly engages in unsafe or disruptive activity will be excused from the field for the day without the benefit of a refund. The decision of the Field Committee is final.

The club will refund all entry fees, less \$6.00 per day, for bitches in season when written or email notification is received by the Event Secretary at least 30 minutes before the start of judging on the first day of the trials.



INSPECTION, COLLARS, and MUZZLES

- Each entry will be examined by the Inspection Committee and may be measured with a wicket at inspection. An inspection shall take place before any form of wrapping is applied to the dog. No dog shall compete if it is taped, bandaged in any way, or has anything attached to it for medical purposes.
- Dogs may wear any type of collar *except* choker collars, a collar with prongs, or an electronic training collar.
- Muzzles are allowed, as is the use of rubber bands or clips to hold the dog's hair.
- Spayed and neutered dogs, without breed disqualifications, may be entered.

OPERATIONAL INFORMATION

- All dogs will run once per entry unless an equipment failure occurs.
- At check-in, all exhibitors entered will receive an Entry Card for each run entered for the day. Do NOT lose these cards! The exhibitor must present the card when they are ready for their run.
- Exhibitors are responsible for arranging for at least one person to assist them in releasing and catching their dog.

GENERAL INFORMATION/RULES

- THIS IS AN OUTDOOR EVENT. Please bring your own chair, shade, and water. In [August](#), the humidity is low, daytime temperatures average about 85°F, and the sun is surprisingly strong.
- A small pool of water will be available for the dogs near the check-in area.
- No one, except Field Committee members, will be allowed on the field without expressed permission from a member of the Field Committee.
- A fine of \$5 will be assessed for loose dogs when Fast CAT is in progress.
- Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the showgrounds. Please use them.
- BACM and YDS assume no liability for injury to any person or dog before, during, or after the event. *The safety of the dog* is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the AKC Regulations and the physical demands of this sport and that their dog is fit for competition. • FAST COURSING ABILITY TESTS—Fast CAT

Eligibility

Fast CAT events are open to all dogs that are at least 12 months of age (day of trial) and individually registered with the AKC, recorded in the Foundation Stock Service (FSS) program, individually registered with a foreign or domestic registry organization whose pedigrees are acceptable AKC registration, dogs granted a Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL) number, dogs with AKC limited or conditional or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners Program. Dogs with breed disqualifications and monorchid/cryptorchids are eligible to participate.

Females in season may NOT enter. A dog may enter only ONCE per event.

Fast CAT Runs

An entry, running alone, shall receive a qualifying run when the dog completes a 100-yard straight course.

Break-the-beam equipment is used to obtain times for each dog. The lure is a white plastic bag on a continuous loop system.

Ribbon Prizes

Trial Ribbons—A light blue ribbon will be awarded to each dog that completes the 100-yard dash

Rosettes—a BACM New Title Rosette for earning a new title

Trial Hours and Times

8:30 am to 3:00 pm

The final check-in for Run Cards will be at 3:00 pm.

Final entries will be run each trial at 3:00 pm until complete.

Inspection

The Inspection Committee will inspect each entry for lameness, fitness to compete, and females in season. Any entry found, in the opinion of the Inspection Committee, to be lame, unfit to compete, or a female in season shall not be allowed to enter. Entry fees shall be refunded if the Inspection Committee judges the dog unable to participate.

Running Order

The running order is the order in which you present your Entry Card to the designated Field Trial person. Each exhibitor will receive one Entry Card per entry and can present the card when they are ready to complete their Fast CAT entry.

SITE INFORMATION

Building

The spacious facility is pleasant, well-maintained, and newly renovated. The main building offers a few tables and concessions. Items range from snacks and beverages to full meals. The building also features pleasant restrooms with hot and cold running water. The main building is usually open from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm on Saturday and Sunday.

IMPORTANT! We ask that you wear indoor shoes—separate from your normal shoes—or go barefoot (with or without socks) whenever you are on the green indoor turf. We want our new turf flooring to last a long, long time. You can help by not tracking in dirt, sand, gravel, mud, grit, or snow. Special footwear is unnecessary on the black rubber mat or grey cement floors.

Grounds

Outdoors are several fenced areas for exercising your dog, a pond with a dock, and ample parking. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites are situated around the

show grounds for picking up after your dog relieves himself. Please use them.

The trial grounds include all buildings and the surrounding parking area and pastures. The show grounds are available for set up on Friday morning, August 18, 2023, starting at 11. Space for crating indoors is limited and available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Please crate your dogs in designated areas only. Crates may be left in the building overnight, but anything left inside or outside is at the owner's risk. Neither BACM nor Yellowstone Dog Sports is responsible for loss or theft.

Dogs

Dogs are welcome just about anywhere on the show grounds except as indicated. Dogs must be secured on leash, in their crate, or in their owner's vehicle at all times. They may be exercised on leash only in designated areas. Dogs may not remain in the arena overnight.

General

All regulations governing the use of this facility and all regulations and decisions of the Field Committee of the Beartooth Agility Club of Montana will be strictly enforced, including those not listed in the premium list. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and children.

The Beartooth Agility Club of Montana, the Event Secretary, and the property Yellowstone Dog Sports and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children.

The club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression or any exhibitor if considered necessary by the club or clubs. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Event Secretary, the Beartooth Agility Club of Montana, or any official thereof.

All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when competing on the Fast CAT course.
